## Pink Eye, Allergies, and Common Illnesses:

Pink eye, also known as Conjunctivitis, is the inflammation or infection of the transparent membrane that lines the eyelid and eyeball. It is often caused by viral or bacterial infections, or allergic reactions. Viral Conjunctivitis can occur with symptoms of a cold, flu, or respiratory infection, and the discharge from the eye is usually watery.

Bacterial Conjunctivitis is associated with thicker discharge that can cause the eyelids to stick together. Allergic

Conjunctivitis typically occurs in both eyes and may be accompanied by symptoms such as itchy nose, sneezing, a scratchy throat, or asthma. Pink eye can be contagious, so early treatment is important to limit its spread.

Preventative measures include practicing good hygiene, such as avoiding touching the eyes with hands and frequent handwashing. It is important to note that pink eye is more contagious than the common cold. While medical attention is not always necessary, the second list of resources provides information on when it may be needed.

Allergies are immune responses to substances that are typically not harmful. Those with allergies have an oversensitive immune response. It can be challenging to determine the cause of allergies in children, but healthcare providers can perform tests to diagnose the type and nature of the allergies.

Please refer to the provided resources for information on childhood allergies, as they can sometimes be mistaken for asthma. Fever, colds, and flu are the most common illnesses in children from birth to age five.
